Notes on hymn "Lord, I want to Be a Christian"

Many slaves embraced the religion of their owners. These slaves found hope and comfort in a merciful God who sent Moses to deliver the household of Israel out of bondage. Converted slaved became more excited about their religion when they encountered Jesus Christ and had sufficient cause to revere and savor passages such as Jn. 8:31b-32: "If you continue in my word, you are truly disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." Such sentiment provided slaves with visions of a brighter tomorrow where ultimate release would occur. In contrast to many owners who practiced a part-time religion on Sunday with their mouths and tongues, converted slaves desired to practice a full-time religion every day with their hearts and minds. This spiritual is universally appealing, as it continues to speak to all practicing Christians with freshness.
